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Understanding Point of View and Tone

Authors will often give their **point of view**. This is what the author thinks about a subject. An author expresses a point of view by choosing a particular **tone**. The author's tone is the feeling that the author creates for the readers.

Read the passage. Then answer the questions that follow.

Americans are gaining too much weight. They are not doing what it takes to stay healthy. There are a number of reasons for this. Meal sizes have gotten larger. And people do not exercise as much as they need to. Many people watch too much TV and eat junk food.

Bad habits start young. Many kids are spending time on computers, playing video games, or watching TV all day long. Some

parents and schools do not offer healthy lunches and snacks. Some schools do not offer enough time for exercise and play.

What can you do to stay healthy? Eat more fruits and vegetables. Drink lots of water. Find ways to play outside or inside. And avoid junk food. Try to get your whole family to get healthy. Take walks together. Turn off the TV and dance. Or play a sport with family and friends.
