

Using an Idea Web


One way to find the main ideas and supporting details is to use a graphic organizer, such as the idea web below. The main idea is written in the center of the web. The supporting details are connected by lines to the main idea. The finished idea web will look like a spider's web. Read the passage. Then complete the idea web below. Camels have to be approached with care. If a camel doesn't want to be friendly, it may spit at you or cover you with green slime. Or it might suddenly move its long neck toward you and bite your arm, shoulder, or leg. If you are standing too close, it could kick you. Unlike a horse or a mule, a camel can kick with its/front or back legs. Worst of all, camels attack without notice. And they don't seem to need a reason. Using an Idea Web ?
