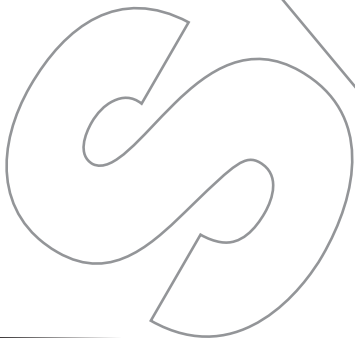

- 1 Doughnuts are made from dough. First, bakers shape the dough into a circle. Then they cut a hole in the middle of the dough. They use a special tool to do this. Then they fry the rings in hot oil.
