His grandmother helped him in many ways. She helped him pay for art school. She also taught him how to tell good stories. Marc's grandmother was a good storyteller, too.





His mother, Nancy, died when he was only 10 years old. His father married again. His new wife, Sarah, had three children. She was a good and kind mother.


Abe worked with his father when he was young. He did not go to school very much. However, he did like to read books. He could also do math.


Abe worked to become a lawyer. He was chosen by the people to help make laws for the state of Illinois. He married Mary Todd and they had four children.
