Some stories are fiction. This means they are made-up. They are not true. Stories are all different. But they have parts that are the same. A story has **characters**. Characters are the actors in the story. A story has a **plot**. The plot is what happens. There is often a problem. The plot tells how the characters solve the problem. A story has a **setting**. The setting is when the story takes place. It is also where the story takes place. All these things make a good story.

The story starts at Juan's house early in the morning. The rest of the story takes place at Stormy Lake. This is where Juan, Grandpa, and Aunt Eva go fishing.

Cat put Bird down on the ground. Then she started to lick her paws. And she washed her face. Bird flew quickly to a high branch in a tree. There he chuckled at Cat. He sang a song because he was happy.

Cat was upset. She did not like to be tricked by Bird. From that day on, she only washed after she finished eating.

That is why you see cats washing themselves after they eat. They never wash before they eat. They learned their lesson.
