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
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Finding Places and Things on a Map

A <u>map</u> is a drawing of a place as you would see it from above. A picture, like the one below, shows how things look. A map, like the one below, shows where things are.

Look at the map above. Then read each sentence below. Circle the word that tells where each thing is.






Comparing Size Using a Map
