- Houseboats are real boats. People just choose to live on them. These people call themselves "liveaboards." Most houseboats are about 35 to 40 feet long and 12 feet wide. But inside are beds, closets, and a tiny kitchen and bathroom. Space can be very tight.
- So why would anyone want to live on a boat? For one thing, it can be a lot of fun. Liveaboards can sail to different places whenever they want. They can stop to explore or decide to keep going. They can meet other liveaboards and share their adventures. They can also fish for dinner right off the side of their homes!
- But living on a houseboat can be hard, too. During a storm, it can be very wobbly. And liveaboards have to be able to get along with each other. There's not much room to be alone on a houseboat.
