



Money can be **bills** or **coins**. Each type of bill or coin has a different value.

**Coins** are small and round. Each coin is a different size.

Coins are used for money values that are less than 1 dollar.  
These are coins.



**Bills** are made of paper. Bills are always the same size.

The numbers in the corners of a bill show the value of that bill.

Bills are used for money values that are dollar amounts.  
These are bills.
