

EXTENSION ACTIVITY

- 1. Lead students in a brainstorming session about weather. Record their ideas on the board. Then guide students in categorizing weather patterns by season. Guide students to see that some kinds of weather, like rain or sunshine, happen in all four seasons, while other patterns/like snowstorms rarely happen in summer. Point out that some places on Earth do not have the same seasons. as in North America. Use a globe to explain that many places near the equator have two seasons—a rainy season and a dry season. Review the sequence of the seasons. Remind students that the seasons are a cycle that repeats year after year.
- 2. Have students work with a partner to talk about experiences they have had in different weather conditions. Then have them draw pictures of a weather experience they remember well. Encourage them to write what happened first, what happened next, and what happened last. Attach their stories to their pictures and display them for all to enjoy.
