


Book Organization

Books are paced for 9 weeks of work at 10 lessons per week. One English language arts lesson and one math lesson per day give students a total of 30-45 minutes of daily practice.




Lessons

Lessons provide practice in key English language arts and writing, mathematics, and problem-solving skills at the grade level students recently completed. Real-life topics engage struggling learners.











Reviews

- End-of-Book Review: Skills from the second half of the book








Answer Key






Student Book



The Game of Chess

- 1 There's a legend about how the game of chess came to China. Two travelers taking a break from their journey were playing a game at a roadside stop. Just then the emperor rode up. Curious, he asked the travelers about the game they were playing. When told that one of the pieces was called the king, he ordered their heads cut off for their insult to royalty!
- 2 There probably isn't a country in the world where chess is not played. Yet nobody is sure where it began. Many countries claim to have invented it. The first records of it being played are in



3 The chessboard was the same wherever the game was played. But pieces had different names in different places. In Asia, for example, the bishops were called "elephants." In some countries, the queen was the "counselor." The rules also differed from place to place, sometimes even within the same country. The modern rules began to develop in Italy around 1200. By 1475, chess had become essentially the game we know today. For example, the queen could now move any number of spaces and had become the most powerful piece on the board. But there were still minor differences in the rules that were not standardized until the 1800s. Only then was it possible for any chess player to truly claim the title "World




